The CDC/HACoLA serves as the primary agency administering housing development and homelessness prevention programs in the county. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved funding for the Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center in 2006 as part of the Homelessness Prevention Program. The CDC/HACoLA administers the contract and manages the ongoing development and operation of the service.

Rapid Re-Housing and Landlord Outreach



In times of low vacancy rates for rental housing, the Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center website provides an essential tool for caseworkers and housing locators seeking to place clients in rental units with Rapid Re-Housing assistance. The website also offers a rent comparability feature that can be used to perform rent reasonableness analyses that are required for program implementation.

Benefits of the Service

For Property Providers and Tenants

- A FREE service to list and find housing.
- Easy-to-use search tools return housing listings that meet individual needs. Search by desired rent; bedroom/bath amount: or near work, school, and public transportation.
- Listings let landlords showcase units with pictures, map links, information about eligibility requirements, amenities, accessibility features, and much more.
- Tenants can find specific information on income-restricted, Section 8, handicapped-accessible, and special-needs housing.
- Landlords enjoy 24/7 access to add, manage, and update property listings.
- Housing Specialists in a toll-free call center assist callers with listing and searching for housing.

For Agencies

Help clients find need-specific housing fast with the Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center.

- Comprehensive housing listings are free to search and provide full contact information and details about special-needs amenities.
- Use interactive income calculators and other helpful relocation tools.
- Free trainings and ongoing support are available for agency staff.

Compliance with CDC and HCIDLA Funding





Affordable and special needs rental housing projects that receive funding from the City of Los Angeles (through the Housing and Community Investment Department) and/or the County of Los Angeles (Community Development Commission) are required to register their projects on the Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center website. This requirement supports efforts for affirmative marketing of all units, including units that have accessibility features. Support and training services are always available to answer questions and assist with property registration.

For Public Housing Authorities (PHA)

- The Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center can manage, update, and provide vacancy listings to tenants.
- The service helps increase voucher utilization and save significant agency time and resources.
- Easy-to-use rent reasonableness tools are based on the most current and accurate rental housing data in the industry.
- A GIS-integrated search tool reveals PHA jurisdictions where units are located.
- Serving in collaboration with the Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles (HACoLA), Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA), and the City of Pasadena, and growing.

Landlords can have units advertised in additional private searches when they opt to serve particular populations with special-needs, from Veterans to students to people with disabilities or HIV/AIDS.

A confidential search tool available for agencies helps caseworkers to quickly link special-needs renters with the landlords and housing they need.

Supplemental Listings for Housing Navigators

The Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center housing locator system focuses primarily on publicly-available rental units of all types (including subsidized or income-based). The website supports, but does not replace, the Coordinated Entry System or HMIS data management. Instead, it supplements the network of rental listings for accessible units, Rapid Re-Housing, and other types of critically needed housing information for all of Los Angeles County.
